1. **This guide reflects course requirements for most Criminal Justice majors. Requirements may vary from one institution to another. You are responsible for consulting the university to which you plan to transfer for details.**
2. Your GPA is very important. Many Criminal Justice programs require a minimum GPA of 2.5 for admission to the major, but it varies depending upon the university to which you plan to transfer.
3. Science course recommendations are based upon conversations with law enforcement administrators. Officers will benefit from a basic understanding of chemistry for HAZMAT issues and weather and climate for spotting severe weather.
4. Courses listed on this plan are based on availability online, additional courses may be available through other UW Colleges campuses.
