3. Your GPA is critical. Most universities require a minimum 2.75, but typically need a 3.0 or higher due to competitiveness of programs.
4. Plan to take the Praxis CORE, a standardized test required for entry into education programs, at the end of your freshman year. This requirement may be waived if ACT scores meet a minimum requirement.
5. Please consult your advisor for assistance in course selection and transfer planning.

You are responsible for your academic plan. Confirm your academic plan with an advisor at the campus to which you plan to transfer.
