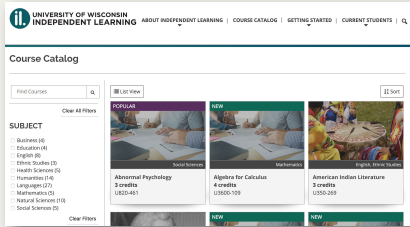


Independent Learning features



- **Open enrollment:** no application process; if student meets prerequisite they can enroll in the course; no seat caps or waitlists
 - **ECCP:** Requires UW IL ECCP Form
- **Asynchronous:** open enrollment every day of the year
 - **ECCP:** UW IL ECCP Form due by April 15 for summer
- **Self-paced:** students set their own pace; have 6 months from their registration date to complete the course; paid extension up to 12 months available
 - **ECCP:** Summer session students start on May 6 and end on August 30 (can extend without additional cost until November 6 and with fees until May 6, 2020)
- **Transferability:** credit-eligible courses transfer within the UW system and to many other colleges and universities

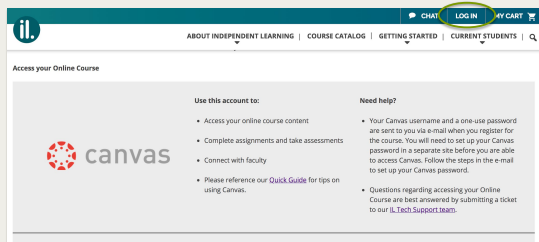

Online IL course experience

Traditional online course	IL online course
Structured – assignments are completed on a weekly basis	Flexible – assignments and exams can be completed anytime
All coursework must be completed within the term or semester	All coursework must be completed before course expiration date
Active discussion boards and/or group projects	Little to no interaction with other students
Weekly feedback is provided by the instructor	Feedback is provided by our faculty as work is submitted

8 Ways to Develop Metacognitive Skills

- Know You Don't Know It All**
Knowing the gaps in your knowledge is the first step to learning.
- Set Yourself Great Goals**
Goals should be both challenging and realistic.
- Prepare Properly**
It's essential to prepare in an hour or two before class.
- React Better to the Feedback You Get**
Feedback is a wealth of information on what you do well at and what you need to fix.
- Monitor Your Performance**
Don't wait until the end of class to see how you're doing.
- Seek Out Feedback**
The important part of feedback is how you react to it, not how you receive it.
- Keep a Diary**
This will help you reflect on your learning.
- Ask Yourself Good Questions**
This is the most important skill. Ask yourself "What did I do well on?" and "What did I do poorly on?" and "What can I do better on next time?"

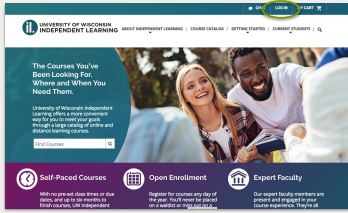

ECCP registration process:

1. Submit IL ECCP Form on or before April 15, 2019
2. Student receives email notification week of April 22-26 from Jessica to complete registration on our website

How we Support ECCP Students

- Proactive advising emails are sent to our ECCP students
- Student Success Coach phone calls to students:
 - 1 week after their registration date
 - 6 weeks into their course
 - 14 weeks into their course
- Counselors are encouraged to contact us for updates on students (FERPA)
