PSD's K12 ACP System

- ACP Coordinator Position
- Advisory Resource with Looping
 - Weekly in 7-8
 - Monthly in 9-12
- Embedded into classes
- Future Ready Days for 9-12
 - Fall & Spring
- ACP Conferences
 - 7–10 with ACP Advisor
 - 11th Grade with School Counselor





We had 9 months to...

- Build & launch ACP curriculum
- Create a conferencing format that was:
 - Effective
 - Transparent
 - Easy for staff to deliver
 - Easy for students to own
 - Flexible
 - Sustainable









- Spoon feed EVERYTHING

The "Elevator Speech"

Purpose:

- To simplify the language of ACP
- To provide a natural start to the conference
- To frame the purpose of the conference for parents

Elevator Speech



The "Essential Questions"

Purpose:

- Used for <u>high school</u> conferences
- Bulk of Conference
- Tailored to ACP activities throughout the year
- Student-owned, teacher-facilitated
- Student preparation for questions

Example: Grade 10 Essential Questions



The "Conference Template"

Purpose:

- Used for middle school conferences
- Bulk of Conference
- Tailored to ACP activities throughout the year
- Student-owned, teacher-facilitated
- Student preparation throughout the year to personalize and complete

Example: Grade 8 Conference Template



"Your Next Steps"

Purpose:

- Emphasis that this journey continues beyond school day/year
- Provide examples and resources for continuing the journey to both parents and students

Handout #2: Labor Market Information

- If often difficult for students & parents to research and understand
- Helps educate on myths and misconceptions

Opening the Door to Each Child's Future... So They are Prepared to Open Doors for Themselves

In less than 5 weeks, 394 documented individual ACP conferences were held.

96% of conferences included a parent

"I felt like honest, genuine conversations took place between the student, parent(s) and myself! I really enjoyed having the student take the lead with this and I was more of a facilitator, asking follow up questions and guiding the meeting as needed"

"Impressed and grateful for this process starting in middle school" ~Parent

WHAT WAS VALUABLE?

- 80% of students/82% of parents felt that discussing goal-setting and progress was valuable
- 75% of students/80% of parents found the personality assessment valuable
- 69% of parents found having a facilitated conversation was helpful
- 64% of students felt that having parents involved was helpful
- 8% of students/5% of parents did not find the conference valuable

FUTURE RECOMMENDATIONS:

- Can the conferences (for 8th grade) be held before they choose classes for PHS?
- Increase time to explore personality styles and careers
- Mid-year updates to families on ACP Activities in school
- Increased support with post-PHS planning, selecting PHS classes, & financial literacy
- Make the lessons more engaging for students

STAFF CONCERNS:

- It would be best to conference with the students you have in advisory
- Challenges balancing ACP with flexi-sched
- Can we make more time to talk and conference with students individually?
- Struggles with answering questions about PHS courses

"It's important that we begin learning about it (options after HS) now, so we have a better idea of what classes to take in HS."

In less than 4 weeks, 403 documented individual ACP conferences were held.

93% of conferences included a parent

"These sessions are a great way for the student and parent to review what is going on for the student and look to what is coming in the future." ~Parent

"I couldn't have had a better experience." ~Parent

WHAT WAS VALUABLE?

- 79% of students/84% of parents felt that discussing careers of interest was valuable
- 70% of students/84% of parents felt that discussing goal-setting and progress was valuable
- 64% of students/63% of parents felt that having a facilitated conversation about future planning was valuable
- 10% of students/4% of parents did not find the conference to be beneficial


FUTURE RECOMMENDATIONS:

- Increased career/post-secondary exploration and financial literacy exposure
- Hold ACP Advisory at a different time of day
- More frequent advisory meetings & conferences
- Look for ways to better personalize the ACP experience
- Explore ways for more ongoing dialogue between parents and students

STAFF CONCERNS:

 How to help students who are unprepared "I would like more frequent meetings or smaller groups for more personal help." ~Student

- More time in Advisory for students to prep for conferences
- Tech improvements: Canvas/Career Cruising





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
