Culturally Sustaining Multi-tiered Systems of Support: Prevention and Intervention for All Students (K-12)

Jennifer Betters-Bubon, Associate Professor, University of Wisconsin Whitewater

School counselors are leaders in implementing multi-tiered systems of supports (MTSS), such as PBIS and RTI, ensuring these frameworks are aligned with their comprehensive school counseling program, such as the ASCA National Model. Aligned programs meet the needs of all students across three tiers of support, serving all students through Tier 1 universal curriculum and support, some students through Tier 2 academic and behavioral interventions and few students through Tier 3 intensive services. These approaches should infuse culturally sustaining practices to combat disproportionality in school discipline and educational access, while also creating effective, equitable and antiracist learning environments.

This preconference sectional will focus on the implementation and alignment of the ASCA National Model and MTSS. Integrated MTSS/school counseling programs allow school counselors to strengthen systems that organize initiatives, such as trauma informed practices, academic and career planning, mental health, SEL, into organized frameworks. Through this dynamic presentation, participants will examine their school counseling program, identifying ways to strengthen data collection, analysis, and interventions with MTSS initiatives. Participants will have opportunities to consider how evidence-based practices, universal mental health screening, and culturally sustaining practices fit within aligned programs. Come have your MTSS questions answered and leave with strategies you can use to strengthen your work as a school counselor.

White supremacy is responsible for the cycle of inequities in education and can be interrupted if we understand the mechanisms that uphold this system and take personal accountability for the ways in which we contribute to it as educators. This accountability includes learning new practices that promote educational equity and inclusivity for ALL students.

WISEdata 102: WISEdata 102 for School Counselors (K-12)

This sectional will assist School Counselors with the validation rules within WISEdata Portal and how to view data in WISEdash for District. WISEdata Portal and WISEdash for District access is required prior to attending the sectional. The WISE reporting system in WI is compiling data for accountability, funding, college career readiness, and overall school data. Questions are welcome on how fix data issues in WISEdata Portal. Roster, Career Education, and Program data reporting will be included. School Counselors can utilize these reports for equitable practices within their Comprehensive School Counseling Program, ACP, Regional Career Pathways, and course sequencing guidance for ALL students, staff and parents. School Counselors must have access to WISEdata Portal and WISEdash for District.

As a trained Wellness Circle facilitator, you will help groups of adults, parents, or teens (think people in your school community) assess their wellbeing, develop personal goals,

and support each other in creating further wellness in their lives. This six-week-long journey results in everybody leading more self-aware, healthy, and more satisfying lives. LMFTs Holly and Scott Stoner have designed unique lessons for discussion and an eight-part wellness assessment for each type of Wellness Circle, with adult and teen circles focusing on their own wellness objectives, and parent circles focusing on developing a better understanding of both themselves and the wellbeing of their families.

Addressing Racism In Schools (K-12)

Derek Francis, Manager of Counseling Services, Minneapolis Public Schools

Whether it is a social media post or something said in the hall at passing time, racism impacts the school environment. Many educators find themselves stuck and looking for answers to respond. This is not a fire drill, there is no one-pager with explicit directions. There is no flow-chart for processing these traumas. As our country and our schools try to heal and make changes to a fundamentally flawed system, it is critical we proactively engage students in conversations of race. Our students are looking for ways to talk and process a wide range of emotions. School counselors are called to do the social emotional work of fighting racism. This session will provide strategies to proactively address racism in school. Attendees will leave with concrete strategies to respond when major racial incidents happen in school or the community.

Effective School Counseling Utilizing Solution Focused Theory (K-12)

Challenging clients require a strong theoretical foundation for school counselors to effectively perform their jobs. Solution Focused Theory provides a solid foundation for working with all clients. But how do you remember what to do when things are seemingly out of control? This

presentation provides an effective and interactive overview of the basic tenets of SFT, tips, techniques, and the opportunity to explore how apply SFT beliefs immediately after the WSCA conference.

Ask not "How are you?" but "Where are you?": Using Pictorial and Word Imagery Continuums When Supporting Students Experiencing Grief (K-8)

Mary Brey, Consultant, Mindful Steps & Teacher, The American School of Tampico (Tampico, Mexico)

"How are you?" can be the "dreaded question" when someone is in the depths of grief and does not know "how" they are or are too afraid to express the truth. Transform your practice by turning "How are you?" into "Where are you?" using vivid pictorial and word-imagery continuums to create connections, build and strengthen relationships, and provide a safe space for individuals to be "where they are" as they navigate the overwhelming pervasiveness of grief. The imagery scales create pathways for deeper introspection and self-awareness, which, in turn, help individuals nurture their emotions and feelings.

This interactive session will demonstrate the power of using these scales in four areas:

1.) Provide versatile support opportunities. The imagery-scales allow for simple check-ins, a shared language, a pathway to self-reflection, and a deeper-dive into grief work.

2.) Promote understanding and normalization of grief reactions. Attendees will learn how the use of these scales is aligned with current grief theory and models.

3.) Foster self-awareness through mindfulness. Implementing the scales into a mindful practice can allow for the readiness for healing and building resilience.

4.) Open avenues for meaning-making and continuing bonds. Topic-themed, personalized scales can facilitate individuals as they explore meaning in their "new normal."

Participants will leave with research-backed tangible tools aligned with Wisconsin's SEL competencies. Start asking "Where are you?" with imagery scales and discover how pictorial and word-imagery continuums can be a game-changer in your practice in grief support and beyond.
